Old Testament

Exodus 15-17 (excerpts)

Then Moses led Israel from the Red Sea into the desert...on the fifteenth day of the second month after they had come out of Egypt...the whole community grumbled, "If only we had died by the Lord's hand in Egypt! There we sat around pots of meat and ate all the food we wanted, but you have brought us out into this desert to starve this entire assembly to death."

The Lord said to Moses, "I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them, 'At twilight you will eat meat, and in the morning you will be filled with bread. Then you will know that I am the Lord your God.'"

That evening quail came and covered the camp, and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. When the dew was gone, thin flakes like frost on the ground appeared on the desert floor. When the Israelites saw it, they said to each other, "What is it?" For they did not know what it was.

Moses said to them, "It is the bread the Lord has given you to eat."

The people of Israel called the bread manna. It was white like coriander seed and tasted like wafers made with honey.

The whole Israelite community set out... traveling from place to place as the Lord commanded. They camped [where] there was no water for the people to drink. So they quarreled...and said, "Give us water to drink."

Moses replied, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you put the Lord to the test?"

But the people were thirsty [so] they...said, "Why did you bring us up out of Egypt to make us and our children and livestock die of thirst?"

Then Moses cried out to the Lord, "What am I to do with these people? They are almost ready to stone me."

The Lord answered Moses, "Walk on ahead of the people. Take with you some of the elders of Israel and the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. I will stand before you by the rock. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it for the people to drink." So Moses did this in the sight of the elders of Israel.

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Sermon

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.
